<p>Take a practice spelling test on Spelling City</p>	<p>Write each word neatly 5 times each.</p>	<p>Write your words forwards and backwards in alphabetical order.</p>	<p>Write your words on graph paper and have them intersect using a common letter W O R D O R W O R D</p>	<p>Record yourself saying each word and spelling them aloud</p>
<p>Write your spelling words in ABC order.</p>	<p>Play spelling games on Spelling City for at least 15 minutes</p>	<p>Use your best CURSIVE and write your words 3 X each NEATLY on a sheet of notebook paper. They must be spelled correctly! **You can print a cursive sheet from spelling city to use if you wish!</p>	<p>Ransom Note---</p> <p>Create your own "ransom note" by cutting each letter from a magazine for each of your spelling words and gluing them on a sheet of paper. Make sure your words make a message! (You can include other words to help it make sense.)</p>	<p>Practice spelling your words creatively, use playdough, slime, wiki sticks, pipe cleaners, sand etc.</p>

<p>Look up definitions for each of your words, create a practice list or flashcards</p>	<p>Use your words to create pairs of “would you rather” questions that require the reader to make a choice. Each pair must be related. Each choice must include at least ONE word.</p>		<p>Pick SEVEN of your vocab words and put them in sentences with alliterations (many words starting with the same sound). A dictionary can help you! EX: Bob brought bananas in his blue basket for the brilliant boys</p>	
<p>Quiz Create a quiz to test someone else’s knowledge of the vocabulary words.</p>	<p>In Your Own Words Write the vocabulary definitions in your own words.</p>	<p>Practice your vocabulary words in a manner that works for you. Please clear with the teacher.</p>
